#1 Describe a notable management accomplishment achieved by the agency during the reporting year (2023). Describe how responsible, informed leadership and effective, efficient processes led to high-quality, accessible, and well-managed services and strategies.

- 1) Sutter County Community Action Agencies sub-grantee, Yuba-Sutter Legal Center for Seniors, had their new Directing Attorney attend the first annual retreat for Executive Directors of Legal Aid organizations in California in 2023. This event allowed him to meet professionals in similar roles and create a support network of legal aid professionals in California that he has called on already throughout the year in an effort to help improve their processes and systems.

For example, from his new peers, he learned of different software options for managing a small and medium sized law firms case management, client onboarding, calendar, time keeping, etc that are flexible enough to be adapted to non-profit profile and needs. Yuba-Sutter Legal Center anticipates that once their new software system is fully implemented, it will allow them to more effectively and efficiently track their services and time spent and will help them pursue further grant funding sources that they have not had the capacity to pursue in the past.

#2 Provide an example of ways in which the agency addressed a cause or condition of poverty in the community using an innovative or creative approach. Provide the agency name, local partners involved, outcomes, and specific information on how CSBG funds were used to support implementation.

- 1) **Agency/Program Name:** Sutter County Community Action Agencies sub-grantee, Sutter Yuba Homeless Consortium—Adventist Health / Rideout Food Security Program

CSBG service category: Health and Social Behavioral Development

Description of program: The hospital utilizes a screening protocol to identify patients who are food insecure and connect them with both food and resources to access post hospital discharge. The capacity is expendable in that the program will assist all patients that are identified as food insecure either directly or by providing resources and/or referrals.

How innovative/creative: Every patient who is admitted to Adventist Health and Rideout is asked specific questions regarding food insecurity. If those screening questions reveal a need, the patient is then referred to the Food Security Program to provide individualized resources, referrals, as well as either a referral to pick up food from a local pantry or a bag of shelf stable food upon discharge. Combatting hunger as a part of patient's care plans is a unique approach to providing whole person care. In addition, participants are given the option of further nutrition education.

Outcomes achieved: Adventist has served 204 people across the Sutter County region in this program. They have increased their reach to serve not only the most vulnerable in the community but with the expansion of the Medically Tailored Meal program they have notable health condition improvements for their patients with specific medical conditions. By expanding their reach, they have been able to help fight hunger and provide wholeness and hope, one bag/meal, one person and one family at a time.

How CSBG funds were used CSBG funds were used to staff a Registered Dietitian to expand, improve, and operate the Food Security Program.

Local partners involved and how contributed:

- Anthem Blue Cross-provided Medically Tailored Meals

- California Health and Wellness-provided Medically Tailored Meals
- Yuba Sutter Food Bank -provided food

#3 Provide an example of changes made by the agency to improve service delivery and enhance impact for individuals, families, and communities with low incomes based on their in-depth analysis of performance data.

1) Sutter County Community Action Agencies sub-grantee, St. Vincent de Paul reported the following:

Problem: Many special needs people residing at a Mercy Housing apartment complex in Yuba City had no way to pick up food at their food locker because they were unable to drive and/or had no transportation.

Insight/change based on performance data: Through client input, phone calls, researching the site and speaking with the apartment management, we determined that several residents would qualify for food assistance.

Changes made: St. Vincent de Paul implemented a delivery program that runs as follows:

- a. Once a month, they check in with the management to find out the apartment numbers of the families who want/need food.
- b. Volunteers prepare boxes and bags of food based on the number of people in the household. The boxes and bags are color coordinated by the number of people in the apartment and then are labeled with the apartment number in the complex.
- c. The day of delivery, volunteers load perishable items into the bags, load them in vehicles and deliver to the site. The total delivery goes to the activity center of the complex and the residents walk there later to pick up their food.
- d. Each clients paperwork is updated on the day of delivery to indicate they received food on that date.

2) Sutter County Community Action Agencies sub-grantee, Sutter Yuba Homeless Consortium—Sutter County Health and Human Services reported the following:

Problem: Increased client altercations with staff and other clients and reduced program success.

Insight/change based on performance data: Analyzed client survey results, conversations with clients, staff input, and more to understand and identify the issue. The analysis of current practices revealed a lack of understanding and training on both mental health and substance use disorders. Sutter County Public Health recognized the need for more clinical oversight of the Homeless Services Unit, which included the Better Way Shelter.

Changes made:

- a. The newly hired Program Manager of the Homeless Services Unit has a clinical background as well as being certified in the treatment of substance use disorders for multiple years.
- b. The Homeless Services Unit chartered the innovative solution of hiring two intervention counselors, one being a certified substance use disorder clinician.
- c. Implementation of a calendar which includes a multifaceted training approach to include subjects such as identification and treatment of both substance use and mental health disorders.
